

EWWBNA team observations and follow up:

- **IDADEE** has a building plan for its vocational training center, but has not determined the future electrical load needs of the center.
- It had planned to begin construction of two buildings without an electrical assessment
- EWWBNA asked **IDADEE** and Pittsburgh Kids Foundation to hold off on construction until an electrical engineer can provide an assessment
- EWWBNA is reaching out to organizations such as Engineers Without Borders to assist in the assessment
- Once the assessment is complete, EWWBNA can send volunteers to assist in the electrical as a train-the-trainers exercise
